SECOND PDS OF SEMESTER MARKS RETURN OF CJC GRADUATE


CJC Graduate, Bill Martin, International Director of Security for Cummins, Inc., was the featured speaker in the second CJC Professional Development Seminar of the fall semester. Mr. Martin's presentation titled "Private Security and Criminal Justice," had over 450 students in attendance.

Prior to joining Cummins, Mr. Martin spent 25 years working in Law

Enforcement with the Columbus Police Department, during which he held positions of sworn authority in every major division of the department. In this last position, he served as Chief of Police.

Mr. Martin spoke to students on the importance of global security and the safety issues that are presented to businesses traveling and operating outside of the United States.
