Students interested in more than one of the areas of Family and Consumer Sciences should consider the General Option. With this degree, graduates would be considered generalist with marketable skills in a number of different fields. Students with a degree in this area may find careers in areas such as business, community, and non-profit agencies, government, and communications. This option is combined with an approved minor in another area of study or an associate degree.
