# JANUARY 14-18, 2013, HORIZON CONVENTION CENTER MUNCIE, INDIANA

Are you new to economic development? Does your job require you to have a good understanding of economic development or to make decisions that affect the economic development of your community? If so, then we invite you to register for the **Indiana Economic Development Course** scheduled for the week of January 14 - 18, 2013. The course will be held at the Horizon Convention Center in Muncie, Indiana.

Building Better Communities at Ball State University offers this weeklong, intensive training in the basic concepts, methods and strategies of economic, industrial, business and community development. The course is accredited by the International Economic Development Council. It fulfills one of the prerequisites for those who wish to take the examinations for the Certified Economic Developer (CEcD) designation.

A diverse and experienced faculty of practitioners and academicians covers the key elements of economic development. The curriculum, shared by 25 courses across the country, is augmented by state- and region-specific subject matter.

#### **Application**

In order to create an optimal learning experience for participants we must limit enrollment, so apply early as spaces fill quickly! Those receiving or who have applied for a scholarship should still complete and submit their registration ASAP. Space is allocated based on a first-come, first-served basis. The course fee for all participants is \$695. The fee covers instruction, course manual, class picture, a Thursday evening reception, daily continental breakfasts, Friday buffet breakfast, and Monday thru Thursday lunches.
