Six (6) Credit Course in Three (3) Parts (CAP/ARCH/PLAN/LA 498/598)

1. Preparation – Spring 2010 – 1 hour per week (TBA Noon Monday or Friday)
2. Engagement – Summer 2010 – 3 weeks in 3 cities
3. Publishing – Summer 2010 – 2 weeks on BSU campus after trip

Schedule

The entire trip takes three weeks, one week in each of three cities, with departure from Indianapolis planned for May 12 and return to Indianapolis planned for June 2, 2010.

Rome	Arrive Rome Wed May 26 Day Trip to Florence Depart Rome Wed June 2 Noon
Indianapolis	Arrive Wed June 2 Evening

Participation

Students from Architecture, Planning, Landscape Architecture, Historic Preservation and Urban Design have priority. Open to All BSU students with sophomore standing.

- Maximum of 20 students, 16 preferred, 8-10 per instructor, 2 instructors
- Interdisciplinary teams of students, represent all disciplines in CAP

Students will undergo an intake interview and participate at faculty discretion.

Requirements/Deliverables

- Research paper and on-site presentation on area of predetermined student interest. (Suggested list available from instructors Spring Term)
- One complete sketchbook for each of three (3) cities, i.e., three (3) sketchbooks.
- A "Day in the Life" entry to on line travel journal (YouTube)
- Individual and Team entries to Grand Tour Travel Guide Book

Cost

Field study trip costs estimated at \$6500 - \$7250 per student, at current currency exchange rates and subject to change, in addition to tuition for 6 credits, university fees and professional fees (for architecture students only).

Passport is required, approximate cost of \$120 and 6 week processing time. International Student ID Card is required, \$22/year, readily available at <http://www.myisic.com/MyISIC/>.

Other required items include: walking shoes, daypack, sketchbooks, pens and pencils. No laptops are required or recommended. Opportunities for fund raising as a Travel Team during Spring Term are planned (popcorn sales) and innovative ideas are welcome.
