Proposal Policy Statement

November 15, 2010

The Center for Historic Preservation is an academic unit of the Department of Architecture at Ball State University. In that context, it contributes to the teaching, research, and service mission of the academic department. The outreach activities of the center are in line with that mission and have served Indiana towns, cities, and institutions since its inception in 2004. The center provides learning opportunities for its graduate students through immersive learning activities nested in real-life projects that are supervised by BSU faculty and CHP staff. The center also provides research opportunities for BSU faculty through the exercise of scholarship in the same or additional real-life projects that due to their nature are auspicious for the generation of new knowledge in the domain. Therefore, CHP needs to consistently develop relationships with potential providers of real-life projects and if requested, submit proposals seeking participation in relevant projects. CHP will only submit proposals for projects that suggest clear collegial benefits, and will only submit those proposals upon an invitation by a sponsor. Sponsors can invite CHP to submit a proposal through verbal request to members of the CHP Advisory Board, CHP staff, or by mailing CHP an RFP (request for proposal).
