A Classical Approach for a Contemporary Age: A Digital Platform for Teaching First Year Writing. (Tentative title) This concept was the topic of ENG 444 and ENG 690 in Fall 2009. A summary of the key points from this work with these students is included in the support file. These ideas will be combined with an earlier 800 page manuscript for a first-year writing textbook completed in the 1990's before I became department chair and with graphics and video segments drawn from the ten years I taught ENG 103 on IHETS television. I have discussed with Rodger Smith of the Institute for Digital Entertainment and Education the possibility of producing sections of the program that could be tested in ENG 103. I have also written an application for "assigned leave with pay," included in the support file, to further develop this project.

"Teaching and the Scholarship of Teaching for the Humanities: Beyond the Narrative and Other Simple Concepts."
