Students enrolled in a double-major in English need to contact the Assistant Chair of Operations to decide (in consultation with your primary advisor) which classes will be double-counted. Upon reaching an agreement, a memo will be sent to Advising Center coordinator, Kathryn McCartney (RB 116; x5515), who will enforce this agreement when deciding if the student has completed his/her programs of study (for the purposes of graduation.)

The DAPR cannot easily track your progress through two programs, so you need to keep track manually. The easiest way to do this is to identify the program year of study on your DAPR (2008-09, 2009-10, etc.) for your major(s) and/or minor(s). Then retain a copy of those requirements from the appropriate edition of the UG catalog and check off the classes as you go. Please work with your primary advisor to track your progress through both programs of study. Remember that program requirements can change from year to year and that you must follow the program for the year in which you declared the major(s) and minor(s).

The English Department has passed the following rule for the 11-12 catalog: "English/Language Arts teaching majors may apply two courses to both a major and minor in English. All other students who major and minor in English may apply only one course to both the major and the minor. Students who complete two majors in English may only count ENG 444 and two additional courses towards both majors." Since this rule is more generous than the current one, we will apply it to all students who are enrolled in a 10-11 catalog English major and minor.

Listed below are the classes that you can double count for the following major-minor program combinations. When you apply for graduation, Kathryn McCartney will enforce these automatically to determine if you have correctly followed the rules for double-counting courses.
