- All applicants to the Dietetic Internship at Ball State must be accepted into the Graduate School at Ball State University and the Department of Family and Consumer Sciences to be considered an applicant to the Dietetic Internship.
- All applicants to the Dietetic Internship at Ball State must select Master's Degree Option Dietetics Major on the Graduate School Application
- Receipt of information granting acceptance into the Ball State University Graduate School and the Department of Family and Consumer Sciences, <u>does not indicate</u> acceptance into the Dietetic Internship
- All those accepted into the Dietetic Internship must complete a minimum of 9 graduate credits from Ball State University and maintain a graduate GPA of 3.0 or higher prior to the start of the internship.
- Interns will earn 9 graduate credits during the internship and must earn a 3.0 or higher in each Dietetic Internship Graduate class.
- Following the completion of the internship individuals may choose to continue studies at Ball State University and earn a Master's degree
- The following degrees may be earned
- Masters of Arts in Family and Consumer Sciences with an option in Nutrition
- Masters of Sciences in Dietetics
