Honors 189-2, John Dobelbower: This course will focus on Laos and Cambodia, 2 major players in the Vietnam War. The course will cover the early growth and development of these countries, but we will focus more on 20th century issues involving governmental systems, cultural differences, literature, religious beliefs, and US intervention/involvement. Texts used for discussion will include *A Short History of Cambodia – From Empire to Survival* by John Tully, *Survival in the Killing Fields* by Haing Ngor with Roger Warner, *The Killing Fields* with Haing Ngor (movie), *A Short History of Laos – The Land In Between* by Grant Evans and Milton Osborn, *Mother's Beloved – Stories from Laos* by Bnounyavong Outhine, and *Bamboo Among the Oaks – Contemporary Writing by Hmong Americans* by Mai Neng Maua. Much of the class will be immersive in that we will spend time making items used daily by both cultures and will do presentations/projects based on your individual interests. Honrs 189-3, Eva Weng: Oceans and Nations, is to provide an overview of several key issues on the effects of human activities to the ocean and the international conflicts of interest related to the use of the ocean.

Issues intended to discuss include:

- Law of the sea, national boundaries in the ocean
- Mineral resources
- Fisheries and aquaculture
- Whaling
- Ocean/climate disaster
- Pollution management

A short introduction of the characteristics of the ocean environment will be given at the beginning of the class. Students are expected to conduct a guided literature search and discussion about the past and present interactions (including competition, conflict, and cooperation) of various nations and cultures with the ocean for each issue, and then come up their own thoughts regarding the policy-making for the fate of the ocean, which affects us ultimately.

Honrs 298-1, McKenzie: Honors Symposium in the Life Sciences: Determinants of Health

Explores the major determinants of human health: health behavior, health care, environmental factors, social factors, and heredity. Topics covered include, but are not limited to, measuring health *Healthy People 2010*, levels of prevention, and changing health behavior. This course does not have a lab.

Maths 125, sections. 201 & 202: Title Mathematics of Integrity. The course examines selected topics of contemporary mathematics and its applications, with a specific emphasis on issues of integrity. Topics from the fields of statistics and probability, number theory and cryptography, and decision theory are included.

Prerequisite; admission to Honor College, open only to incoming freshman. Instructors Dr. Dale Umbach and Dr. John Emert. Sections 201 and 202. The instructions of these sections will be coordinated between Dr. Umbach and Dr. Emert.
