

DAVID LETTERMAN SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

1. To be eligible you must:
 - have between 30 and 102 semester hours, effective the end of Fall Semester
 - be a Ball State Telecommunications major or minor enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours at the time of application;
 - and must continue as a full-time student for the semester following the awards presentation.
2. Your creative endeavor will be evaluated by a committee of TCOM faculty and two graduate students. Each evaluator will work independently of all other evaluators. The results for each will be tallied and ranked by the department secretary and the awards will be presented at the Telecommunications Awards Banquet in April.
3. You will be required to attach no more than 2 pages which describe how you conceived, developed, and prepared your creative project. Be sure to credit all outside assistance in whatever way that you may have received it. This is to be the vision of an individual, not a team. Though some entries might necessitate a crew, the submission should still be the "intellectual property of one person." If this is a collaborative effort, only ONE person can be designated the winner. The group will be required to select the designee and submit that person's name, in writing, with signatures of everyone involved in the collaborative group.
4. The amount of the scholarships are:
 - \$10,000 for the Winner
 - \$ 5,000 for the First Runner-Up
 - \$ 3,333 for the Second Runner-UpThese awards will apply to the next academic school year.
5. **All winners** are required to provide copies of their entries to be included in the Letterman Scholarship Library as well as provide an additional copy to the TCOM secretary to send to Mr. Letterman.
6. All winners may be required to demonstrate proof of their project's authenticity before a review board. Therefore, it is important that you keep all source material for the review. Failure to comply with the interview process will jeopardize your award.
