

Ball State University – Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana CONNECT PROGRAM COURSE LISTINGS

(Updated January 01, 2007)

Successful completion of CONNECT guarantees transfer admission to Ball State University for students who were not admitted out of high school (admission to restricted majors is not guaranteed). CONNECT participants are required to earn a minimum of 24 transferable college-level credits at an Ivy Tech site, and earn a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale). Only specific college-level courses (those listed below) in which the student earns a grade of C or better will count toward the 24 credits needed to gain admission to Ball State, and 30 transferable hours are required to enter Ball State with Sophomore status. A CONNECT certified counselor at an Ivy Tech site will help you select classes that satisfy the program requirements. **If you have not applied for admission to Ball State previously, you must do so to be considered for CONNECT.
