Come along on a trip through the solar system and see the Grand Canyon of Mars, the stunning rings of Saturn and visit Pluto where the Sun is just another bright star in the night sky. The Sun with its array of planets, moons and comets is just one example of a countless number of such systems in our galaxy.

The Planetarium shows are **free** of charge. **NO tickets are required**, but plan to arrive early for the best seats. *Weather permitting, the observatory will be open after the evening planetarium presentations.* (Note: the observatory is not heated; dress accordingly.) The Planetarium is located in the southeast corner of the lower level of the Cooper Science Complex (room CP 90). Parking is available on the west end of the Cooper building and along Riverside Avenue. Doors will open 20 minutes before show time. No one will be admitted after the program begins. **Children 12 years and under should be accompanied by an adult.** The programs are approximately 40 minutes long.
